FUNCTION REPORTS

Oceanside Place

Mr. Porteous presented the monthly update for Oceanside Place highlighting the following items:

- Senior Scrub Hockey will be extended into June as participation in the program remains high.
- Registrations for Summer Scrub Hockey are starting to come in.
- Dry floor maintenance is underway at Oceanside Place.
- Ice is out in both the Howie Meeker Arena and The Pond.
- Operational changes to lighting usage, as noted in the Quantum Lighting audit, have begun.
- Parksville Lions have confirmed they are prepared to sponsor the Family Skate Sessions for a trail period of one year. Family Skate Sessions will no longer be offered on Saturdays as the attendance numbers for this skate have diminished. Hopefully, rental revenue will increase during the Saturday time slot due to other user participation and attendance figures will increase for the Family Skate Sessions as clients who may not have been able to afford the sessions in the past, may now be included.
- Programming staff are in the process of preparing the Fall/Winter Active Living Guide.

Ravensong Aquatic Centre/Recreation Coordinating

Ms. Pearson presented the monthly update for the Ravensong Aquatic Centre and the Recreation Coordinating Function highlighting the following items:

- Numerous in-service and staff training sessions were held at the Aquatic Centre in April
 to assist staff in updating their skills and procedures in compliance with
 recommendations from the recent safety audit.
- Program numbers are down slightly, which may be due to the cancellation of some upper level leadership courses. However, private swim lesson numbers are quite good.
- A major water leak in the underground tunnel at the pool has been repaired.
- Four new aquatic staff and a new maintenance person have just joined the aquatic team.
- Two Summer Recreation Assistants and eleven Summer Leaders have been hired. Junior leaders and inclusion workers will round out the summer staff.
- The fourth year of hosting the Eat Well Get Moving Program with the School District has begun. In the fifth and final year, 2010, staff will be planning a wrap-up event which will coincide with the opening of the Games.
- Move For Health Day in Qualicum Beach was very poorly attended.
- A \$4,000 Public Awareness Grant has been received to be used to promote physical activity for adults in the 35 to 54 years age bracket.
- The final clue for the 2009 *Golden Shoe Hunt* will be out Friday. This program has had a great response from the Community.
- Nineteen people participated in the Run the River program held on the Big Qualicum River Trail

Regional Parks and Trails and Community Parks (EA 'E' - 'H')

Mr. Osborne presented the monthly update for the Regional Parks and Trails and Community Parks (EA 'E' - 'H') highlighting the following items:

- Stairs have been installed in Brickyard Community Park in Area 'E'.
- Substantial engineering work is required along the French Creek in Area 'G' in an effort to restore the bank.
- A boardwalk is currently been constructed in Deep Bay Community Park.
- Work on the Mt. Benson Regional Park Management Plan and the 707 Community Park Management Plan continues.
- A grant application has been submitted for two bridges and related trail work on the Lighthouse Country Regional Trail.
- Discussions with the four municipalities and the Regional District are in progress regarding the procurement of an agreement with the Island Corridor Foundation for a Licence of Occupation, which would cover the entire rail corridor as part of the E & N Rail Trail initiative. If successful the whole corridor for trail access from Cassidy to Deep Bay and over to Cathedral Grove will be covered.
- Horne Lake Regional Park is entering its busy summer season. The group campsite is complete.

Recreation Infrastructure Canada

Mr. Osborne stated a new grant called the Western Economic Diversification Canada - Recreational Infrastructure Canada Program has been announced by the federal government. This grant will provide one third funding up to a one million dollar cap and is specifically ear marked for recreation infrastructure. Mr. Osborne noted the earlier grant application to the Canada – BC Building Canada Fund – Communities Component did offer two thirds funding without a dollar cap. Mr. Osborne suggested the Commission should consider applying for this additional grant as the criteria is more specific to the Ravensong project and also as a backup should the BC Building Canada Fund grant be denied.

MOVED Commissioner Flynn, SECONDED Commissioner Biggemann, that the Regional Board support an application for the repair and upgrades of the Ravensong Aquatic Centre under the Western Economic Diversification Canada – Recreational Infrastructure Canada Program and commit to cover the Regional District's share of eligible project costs and ineligible project costs.

Manager of Recreation Services

Mr. Osborne announced Mr. Dean Banman has been confirmed as the successful candidate for the position of Manager of Recreation Services. Mr. Banman will be joining the Recreation and Parks Department at the end of June.

COMMISSIONER ROUNDTABLE

Commissioner Patterson reported the City of Parksville is investigating the possibilities of hosting the 2011/2012 BC Senior Winter Games.

Commissioner Flynn reported the 2009 School District Budget was passed. Some bus routes will be cut to meet the budget shortfall. An open house was held May 13 for parents to review transportation safety, rural vs. urban issues, charging or not charging for bus service and other issues regarding busing. A revised transportation policy will be presented to the Board next week and made available to parents in June.

Commissioner Flynn noted the Ballenas Dry Grad will be held at Oceanside Place on May 23. The theme this year is Under the Sea. Decorations will include a ship wreck, submarines, whales, jelly fish and more.

Commissioner Biggemann reported he was happy to present a cheque in the amount of \$25,000, on behalf of the Regional Board, to the Arrowsmith Agriculture Association to assist with the construction of the Arrowsmith Activity Hall on the Coombs Fairgrounds.

Commissioner Biggemann noted a group of railroad speeder riders are in the process of clearing train track from Whiskey Creek to Port Alberni in preparation of a ride by thirty people which is to be held on June 30. The speeder riders will travel from Whiskey Creek to Port Alberni and then on to Courtenay, using Parksville as their base.

Commissioner Nosworthy noted the following items:

- A Getting to Know Your Community Social will be held on June 28.
- The After School Activity Program will end in June. Plans are underway to secure grant funding to continue the program.
- Summer camps are scheduled at French Creek Community School July 20 to 24 and at Errington Elementary Community School July 27 to 31.
- The Arrowsmith Community Picnic will be held June 5 at the fair grounds. The picnic is jointly sponsored by ACES and the Arrowsmith Agriculture Association.
- The Electoral Area 'F' Parks and Open Space Advisory Committee reviewed all the parks in Area 'F' and prioritized projects for the next five years at their last meeting.
